Transformation (plenary presentations, 3rd year research fellows):

As part of the compulsory programme, we request 3rd year research fellows to present a summary of how their projects have developed or changed during the fellowship period, from the very first project description through to the presentation for final assessment of the artistic result. These presentations will be conducted in a plenary session, each lasting approx. 30 minutes (not more!), followed by a 15 minutes discussion during which the seminar participants may ask questions and provide feedback. The research fellow is free to choose the form of his/her presentation. (We remind you that English is the working language at all research fellow seminars and meetings.)

Documentation (interdisciplinary group sessions, 1st year research fellows):

As part of the compulsory programme, we request 1st year research fellows to present proposals in groups for relevant forms of documentation, reflection and presentation for their artistic projects. The research fellow must write a brief contribution (lasting approx. 15 minutes), which will form the basis for a group discussion (approx 30 minutes). The groups will be put together on an interdisciplinary basis. The research fellow's main supervisor will take part in the group. (We remind you that English is the working language at all research fellow seminars and meetings.)

Key note speaker Jack Lohman:

Jack Lohman is Director of the Museum of London and Professor at the Bergen National Academy of the Arts.

Of Polish origin, Jack Lohman was educated at the University of East Anglia where he studied Fine Arts. He was awarded a scholarship to read Architecture at the Freien Univeristat in Berlin and later obtained a Masters degree in Architecture at the University of Manchester. He received Honorary Doctorate from the University of Westminster in 2004. Before taking up his present appointment, Jack Lohman was the Chief Executive Officer of Iziko Museums of Cape Town, an organization consisting of fifteen national museums including the South African Museum, the South African Maritime Museum and the South African National Gallery. Here he led the creation of a new museum institution and the transformation of the national museum sector. Between 1985 and 1994, he worked for English Heritage, developing museums and exhibitions both nationally and internationally and later directed TVC Ltd and MET Studio in the development of museum design across the world.

Jack Lohman is Professor of Museum Design and Communication at the Bergen National Academy of Arts in Norway (since 1995), Chair of ICOM (International Council of Museums) UK (since 2002), Chair of the Rothschild Foundation Europe (since 2007) and a member of the UK National Commission of UNESCO (since 2005). He is a Board Member of City of Warsaw Museum and Editor-in-Chief of UNESCO's publication series 'Museums and Diversity'.
